- Minimum score of 70% on GRE Verbal
- Minimum GPA of 3.5

- Completed Application Coversheet. (Save to desktop first and open in Adobe Reader)
- Brief description of thesis, dissertation, or creative/research focus.
- C.V. (May include any work submitted or in-progress as well as accepted publications.)
